# **Punctuality**

All latenesses are formally recorded and will affect your child's attendance rate as they are missing school time.

The Education Welfare Officer (EWO) does make frequent visits to school to monitor attendance and may wish to speak to persistent late comers.

Please ensure your child brings a coat to school every day. We do try to get outside for fresh air where possible, and often a coat is needed. We do have some spare coats in school, but pupils are not keen on wearing these!

# Dungannon Festival !IMPORTANT CHANGE OF PLAN THIS YEAR!

Dungannon Festival will take place during the first week of March 2024. Up until now we have taken all pupils in P4-7 to perform solo pieces on the recorder, and then the whole school to perform in a 'whole school' choir.

This year we are changing things.

#### Recorder:

If your child in P4-7 is **NOT** keen on standing on the stage and performing a solo piece, please let us know before Friday  $24^{th}$  November, and we will not enter your child for that competition.

(Entries close for the festival at the end of November, and any withdrawals after that date, parents will be asked to pay the entry fee, as the school will have it already paid.)

All pupils will be learning the recorder piece as part of their music lessons, regardless of whether they are participating in the Festival or not.

#### Choir:

Due to an increase in our whole school population we feel it will be too tight a squeeze to put all pupils into the one choir on stage. This year we will be taking two choirs. P1-4 and then P5-7. Both choirs will take part in the same non-competitive competition.

We expect all pupils to participate in the singing performances at the Festival. Again, these pieces will be taught in school as part of the pupils' music lessons.
